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GMO STATEMENT

Eggs are not a genetically modified food. This includes shell eggs and eggs used for processed egg products. In the United States, only traditional breeding techniques are used to produce laying hens. Neither chickens nor eggs are modified by genetic engineering.¹

In the chance that a chicken eats genetically modified feed, the digestive process of the hen destroys any products unique to the genetic engineering. Scientific research has confirmed that none of the genetically modified materials are passed into the egg.¹

The following products manufactured by Ballas Egg Products Corp. contain only egg or salt unless noted and are to the best of our knowledge considered non-GMO as defined by current regulations in the US and EU.
